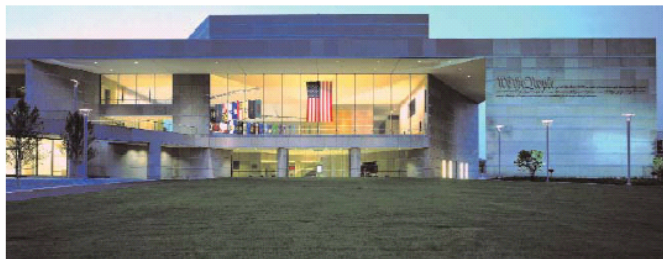

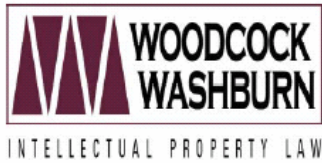
2. BIO 2005 Annual International Convention on June 19-22, 2005 in Philadelphia

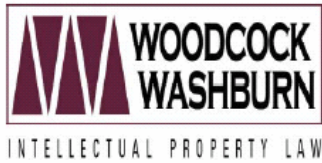

Woodcock opened its new Atlanta office on May 2. Initially, this office will be staffed with four attorneys. **Wendy Choi** and **Larry Aaronson** will be relocating from Woodcock Philadelphia to Atlanta. Wendy specializes in chemical and bio-tech prosecution and counseling, and Larry specializes in electrical and computer prosecution and counseling.

Woodcock Washburn in the Federal Circuit

Recently, on March 9, 2005, **Dale Heist** argued on behalf of Microsoft in *AT&T Corp. v. Microsoft Corp.*, No. 04-1285 (Fed. Cir.) regarding a damages issue under 35 U.S.C. 271(f). The Federal Circuit has not yet ruled on that case. **Dick Kurtz, Lynn Morreale, Dave Bailey, Paul Milcetic, Erich Falke, and Joe Milowic** worked with Dale on the appeal.

Dale Heist also argued on behalf of *Crown Cork & Seal Techs. Corp. in Anheuser-Busch Companies, Inc. v. Crown Cork & Seal Techs. Corp.*, 121 Fed. Appx. 388 (Dec. 23, 2004 Fed. Cir.) (unpublished). The Federal Circuit ruled in favor of Crown Cork & Seal on two main issues. First, the Federal Circuit reversed the District Court's construction of the claims of Crown's patent and its summary judgment of non-infringement of Crown's patent. Second, the Federal Circuit affirmed the district court's judgment that Crown did not infringe Anheuser-Busch's patent. The case has been remanded for findings to the District Court to decide the infringement, validity, and damages issues. **Chad Ziegler and Alfred Zaher** worked closely with Dale on the appeal.



Dianne Elderkin argued on behalf of LifeScan, Inc. in *Home Diagnostics, Inc. v. LifeScan, Inc.*, 381 F.3d 1352 (Fed. Cir. 2004). The Federal Circuit ruled in favor of LifeScan and reversed the District Court’s claim construction and remanded the case for findings on issues of infringement and validity. The case subsequently settled satisfactorily. **Joe Lucci, Lynn Malinoski, and Steve Maslowski** worked with Dianne on the appeal issues.

Lynn Malinoski has served as President of the Philadelphia Intellectual Property Law Association for the past year, and **Mike Swope** is on the board of the Washington State Patent Law Association.

Woodcock Attorneys Serve As Child Advocates

Woodcock Attorneys **Barb Mullin, Rick LeBlanc** and **Chad Ziegler** have been involved with the Support Center for Child Advocates as volunteer attorneys. The Support Center provides legal assistance and social service advocacy to abused and neglected children in Philadelphia. Volunteer attorneys are asked to conduct home visits, participate in service planning meetings and represent their child-client in court hearings.



Woodcock Wins Award for Promoting Women

Woodcock won the Pennsylvania Bar Association's Women in the Profession Award for the Promotion of women to Leadership Positions. The PBA established this award in 2002 to recognize the law firm from among the 100 largest law firms in Pennsylvania that has done the most to promote its women lawyers to leadership positions within the firm.

Woodcock a Gold Sponsor of AIPLEF

Woodcock has been recognized as a Gold Scholarship Sponsor for its multi-year commitment to the American Intellectual Property Law Education Foundation (AIPLEF).
